DECISION AWARDING ATTORNEYS' FEES AND COSTS¹

On February 27, 2008, petitioner filed an application for attorneys' fees and costs. Petitioner requests \$4,829.51 in fees and costs. Respondent has no objection to this request. In compliance with General Order #9, petitioner states that he has incurred expenses of \$248.61. The court finds the amount requested by petitioner to be reasonable.

The clerk shall enter judgment for petitioner and shall direct that the award be in the form of a check made jointly payable to petitioner and Mr. Clifford J. Shoemaker in the amount of \$4,580.90 and in the form of a check made payable to petitioner in the amount of \$248.61. In
