ORDER

On March 28, 2013, the District of Columbia Court of Appeals issued an Order suspending Kenneth A. Martin from the practice of law for eighteen months. That Order went into effect on April 27, 2013. Pursuant to the Rules of the U.S. Court of Federal Claims ("RCFC"), an Order was issued by this court on May 16, 2013, reciprocally suspending Mr. Martin from the practice of law in this court for eighteen months. The Order was entered, *nunc pro tunc*, effective April 27, 2013.

Mr. Martin has submitted to the court a petition for reinstatement that meets the requirements of RCFC 83.2(k), demonstrating that he is fit to resume the practice of law. On October 30, 2014, Mr. Martin was reinstated as an active member in good standing of the District of Columbia Bar. Subsequently, the Virginia State Bar ended its reciprocal suspension and Mr. Martin is once again a member in good standing. Based on the foregoing and for good cause shown, we conclude that it is in the interest of justice to reinstate Mr. Martin and grant his petition. It is therefore

ORDERED that Kenneth A. Martin is reinstated to the practice of law before this court pursuant to RCFC 83.2(k)(3). Reinstatement is effective on the date of entry of this order.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Clerk of Court shall serve Kenneth A. Martin with a copy of this order.
