FINAL ORDER

On October 7, 2016, the Court of Appeals of Maryland issued a *per curiam* order disbarring Mark H. Allenbaugh from the practice of law in Maryland, effective on that same date. *See Attorney Grievance Comm'n of Md. v. Allenbaugh*, 147 A.3d 392, 392 (Md. Oct. 7, 2016). The disbarment order was based on the court's findings that Mr. Allenbaugh had engaged in two separate instances of misconduct, had failed to cooperate with the disciplinary bodies responsible for investigating the allegations against him, and had violated eleven subsections of the Maryland Rules of Professional Conduct. 147 A.3d at 392; *Attorney Grievance Comm'n of Md. v. Allenbaugh*, 148 A.3d 300, 310-19 (Md. Oct. 27, 2016). Mr. Allenbaugh failed to notify the U.S. Court of Federal Claims of his disbarment, a violation of Rule 83.2(e)(1)(B) of the Rules of the United States Court of Federal Claims ("RCFC").

Pursuant to RCFC Rule 83.2(g)(6), an Order to Show Cause was issued by this court on December 27, 2016, directing Mr. Allenbaugh to show cause within thirty (30) days why the court should not impose discipline identical to that imposed by the Court of Appeals of Maryland. To date, Mr. Allenbaugh has failed to respond to the order. Therefore,

IT IS ORDERED that Mark Allenbaugh shall be disbarred from practice before the United States Court of Federal Claims effective, *nunc pro tunc*, October 7, 2016, the date of his disbarment by the Court of Appeals of Maryland. Reinstatement is not automatic. The filing of any petition for reinstatement is to be governed by RCFC 83.2(k).
