FINAL ORDER

On October 23, 2020, the Court of Appeals of Maryland issued an order suspending Stephen Lawrence Snyder's license to practice of law. See *Att'y Grievance Comm'n of Maryland v. Stephen Lawrence Snyder*, Misc. Docket AG No. 21 (Md. 2020). The Court learned of Mr. Snyder's suspension on March 31, 2021, the date the Court of Appeals' order took effect.


Mr. Snyder has been a member of this Court's bar since June 9, 1981 and has no pending cases. Under Rule 83.2(c)(2) of the Rules of the United States Court of Federal Claims ("RCFC"), an attorney may be disciplined on the grounds of an act or omission that results in the disbarment or suspension of the attorney by another court.

On April 16, 2021, the Court issued an order directing Mr. Snyder to show cause within 30 days why he should not be suspended from the practice of law before the United States Court of Federal Claims. ECF No. 3. Mr. Snyder submitted his response to the Order to Show Cause on April 30, 2021. ECF No. 4. Therefore,


IT IS ORDERED that Stephen Lawrence Snyder shall be indefinitely suspended from the practice of law before the United States Court of Federal Claims, *nunc pro tunc*, March 31, 2021, the date this Court received notice of the suspension of his license to practice law in Maryland. The filing of any petition for reinstatement will be governed by RCFC 83.2(k)(1).
